Maybe You Have Heard Someone Say...

If your prayer is not answered, it is because you lack the faith.

The greater the number of people praying for a certain result, the more likely it God will grant that request (praying in agreement).

Some people have the "gift of intercession" which means they have a spiritual gift whereby God listens more to their prayer for others.

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"I tell you the truth, if anyone says to this mountain, 'Go, throw yourself into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart but believes that what he says will happen, it will be done for him." (Mark 11:23)

"Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours." (Mark 11:24)

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"I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it." (John 14:12-14)

IF YOUR PRAYOR IS NOT ANSWORD IT IS BOCAUSO YOU LACK FAITH.



"Then the disciples came to Jesus in private and asked, "Why couldn't we drive it [the demon] out?" He replied, "Because you have so little faith. I tell you the truth, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you." (Matthew 17:19-21)

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"But when he asks, he must believe and not doubt, because he who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. That man should not think he will receive anything from the Lord." (James 1:6-7)

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"The verses are quoted out of context."

"Literary context means that words only have meaning in sentences, and that biblical sentences for the most part only have clear meaning in relation to the preceding and succeeding sentences." – Dr. Gordon D. Fee and Dr. Douglas Stewart

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"Jesus is exaggerating to make the point [using hyperbole]."

Jesus also taught using parables, irony, metaphors, similes, poetry, questioning the questioner, and others methods.


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"To 'move mountains' is a metaphor known to the audience."

The metaphor = to do the most improbable or impossible things.

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"Lazarus was not dead, he was only sleeping."

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Even if Jesus words about faith are read in context . . .

... the statement is not an accurate statement of the totality of Jesus' teachings on the subject, does not reflect the limits placed on these words elsewhere, and does not reflect the full counsel of scripture.

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I John 5:14: "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us."

2. <u>Your prayer may not be answered because it is against God's</u> <u>moral will</u>.

I John 3:22: "And whatever we ask we receive from Him because we keep His commandments and do those things that are pleading in His sight."

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3. <u>Your prayer may not be answered because you are not abiding in</u> <u>Christ</u>.

John 15:7: "If you abide in me, and My words in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done."

4. Your prayer may not be answered because of sin.

1 Peter 3:12: "For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and His ears are open to their prayers; But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil." (citing Psalm 34:12-16)

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James 4:3 "When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures."

6. Your prayer may not be answered because of issues of forgiveness

Mark 11:25: "And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive him, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you."

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And finally . . .

7. Your prayer may not be answered because you lack faith.

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Faith that what you pray for will happen, or faith that God can make it happen? Which one?
