Salvation God's Choosing

"But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers and sisters loved by the Lord, because God chose you as firstfruits to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth. He called you to this through our gospel, that you might share in the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ." - 2 Thessalonians 2:13-14

In love he predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will. . . . In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, in order that we, who were the first to put our hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory." - Ephesians 1:4-6, 11-12



"Not only that, but Rebekah's children were conceived at the same time by our father Isaac. Yet, before the twins were born or had done anything good or bad—in order that God's purpose in election might stand: not by works but by him who calls—she was told, "The older will serve the younger." Just as it is written: "Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated." Mal.1

What then shall we say? Is God unjust? Not at all! For he says to Moses,

"I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion."

It does not, therefore, depend on human desire or effort, but on God's mercy. For Scripture says to Pharaoh: "I raised you up for this very purpose, that I might display my power in you and that my name might be proclaimed in all the earth." Therefore God has mercy on whom he wants to have mercy, and he hardens whom he wants to harden."

One of you will say to me: "Then why does God still blame us? For who is able to resist his will?" But who are you, a human being, to talk back to God? "Shall what is formed say to the one who formed it, 'Why did you make me like this?" Is. 29:16; 45:9 Does not the potter have the right to make out of the same lump of clay some pottery for special purposes and some for common use?

What if God, although choosing to show his wrath and make his power known, bore with great patience the objects of his wrath — prepared for destruction? What if he did this to make the riches of his glory known to the objects of his mercy, whom he prepared in advance for glory — even us, whom he also called, not only from the Jews but also from the Gentiles?"



Can Foreknowledge Make Us Feel More Comfortable About God's Choosing?

"To God's elect . . . who have been chosen according to the foreknowledge of God."

1 Peter 1:1a-2

"For those God foreknew he also predestined..."
Romans 8:29a

Views on God's Foreknowledge

Simple Foreknowledge:

God simply knows everything, including the future, as part of his divine nature. There is no need for us to explain how this is possible.

Foreknowledge Outside Time:

God is outside the bounds of time, so He does not "fore"-know anything. He simply knows all things and experiences eternal "NOW"-ness.

Middle Knowledge:

God knew every possible outcome of every possible world, including every possible decision by free creatures in each possible world. He chose the one that accomplished his purpose.

Diminished Foreknowledge:

Also known as Open(ness) Theism. God settles (and knows) what He wants to settle about the future, and remains "open" about what He wishes to leave open. God does not know future possibilities or future contingency, especially human choices, except in the rare case when they are settled.

Is Choosing Based on Foreknowledge of Our Decision?

Calvinist View (Monergism)

NO

If God's election is based on foreknowledge of action, it would not be based on unmerited grace, but based on the foreknowledge of what we would do. If God is simply foreseeing what we will "do," then salvation is not a work of God. Our heart is simply too sinful to ever turn to God, even for our salvation, without Him working in us first. What God foresees, God ordains.

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Arminian View and Others (Synergism)

YES

God foreknows the believer's faith. Salvation is still solely from God even if we must act to receive it. Without God's action first, there is nothing to receive. Faith is not a form of works that earns anything or credits anything to us. It is merely accepting the gift offered. (Rom. 4:4-5). There are repeated verses affirming human freedom and cooperation (our willingness) in receiving salvation.
